1. In Assignment 2, your group brain-stormed all the ideas you had for your stop on the tour. Now you need to refine those ideas and create a script.

A script is an important part of designing a tour. Writing a script helps you figure out what will be covered at each stop. A script does not have to be an exact word for word account of everything you will say, the way a script is in a play. It is more a general summary of what you will say and do. Point form notes are acceptable. There is no problem with an explicit word for word script, but if it is clear to everyone that you are reading word for word the tour will not seem as interesting and personal.

Your script should cover:

- What you are going to say and do in general, and each idea or point you will cover.
- It should list all props, costumes, and elements of the area that you will use at your stop, when you will use them and how.
- Your script should also include what each member of your group will be doing at your stop on the tour.

2. Create a bibliography. This is a list of all the research sources you have used in researching your stop on the tour. It can include books and newspaper articles, but it should also include any other sources you use, such as any people that you speak to in researching your stop on the tour.

3. Decide what props and costumes you will be using and bring them in to the next class.
